The hymns can be found in the separate hymn book. Indications for sitting, kneeling, and standing are a guide only.

St Peter's Cathedral resides on the lands of the Kaurua people. We give thanks for their ancestors and acknowledge the ongoing right and responsibility of their elders to care for this Country. We are committed to work and pray towards a more just settlement for all Indigenous people and pay our respect to First Nations people with us.

St Peter's Cathedral is a Christ-centred, sacramental, inclusive, thinking, mission-oriented faith community.

Jesus, God's Son, like his ancestor Samuel the prophet, gave life and strength to God's people. God had chosen, called, and endowed Samuel with the gifts and authority of a strong leader of Israel. Samuel called the wayward Israel together and gave them a saving message. The people heard the message to direct their hearts to the Lord, and to serve him only. They believed, obeyed, made meaningful repentance, and God delivered them from the Philistines who sought to destroy them. Jesus' message of God's love and forgiveness was for a people become so numerous that it needed to be taken to them. Jesus chose, called, and endowed twelve apostles with the gifts and authority of strong leaders to proclaim and demonstrate God's saving works, as they had seen him do.

THE FIRST LESSON

1 SAMUEL 7.3-12

The lesson from the first book of the prophet Samuel, chapter 7, beginning at verse 3.

Samuel said to all the house of Israel, 'If you are returning to the Lord with all your heart, then put away the foreign gods and the Astartes from among you. Direct your heart to the Lord, and serve him only, and he will deliver you out of the hand of the Philistines.' So Israel put away the Baals and the Astartes, and they served the Lord only.

Then Samuel said, 'Gather all Israel at Mizpah, and I will pray to the Lord for you.' So they gathered at Mizpah, and drew water and poured it out before the Lord. They fasted that day, and said, 'We have sinned against the Lord.' And Samuel judged the people of Israel at Mizpah.

When the Philistines heard that the people of Israel had gathered at Mizpah, the lords of the Philistines went up against Israel. And when the people of Israel heard of it they were afraid of the Philistines. The people of Israel said to Samuel, 'Do not cease to cry out to the Lord our God for us, and pray that he may save us from the hand of the Philistines.' So Samuel took a sucking lamb and offered it as a whole burnt-offering to the Lord; Samuel cried out to the Lord for Israel, and the Lord answered him. As Samuel was offering up the burnt-offering, the Philistines drew near to attack Israel; but the Lord thundered with a mighty voice that day against the Philistines and threw them into confusion; and they were routed before Israel. And the men of Israel went out of Mizpah and pursued the Philistines, and struck them down as far as beyond Beth-car.

Then Samuel took a stone and set it up between Mizpah and Jeshanah, and named it Ebenezer; for he said, 'Thus far the Lord has helped us.'

SECOND LESSON

MARK 3.7-19

The lesson from the Gospel according to St Mark, chapter 3, beginning at verse 19.

Jesus departed with his disciples to the lake, and a great multitude from Galilee followed him; hearing all that he was doing, they came to him in great numbers from Judea, Jerusalem, Idumea, beyond the Jordan, and the region around Tyre and Sidon. He told his disciples to have a boat ready for him because of the crowd, so that they would not crush him; for he had cured many, so that all who had diseases pressed upon him to touch him. Whenever the unclean spirits saw him, they fell down before him and shouted, 'You are the Son of God!' But he sternly ordered them not to make him known.

He went up the mountain and called to him those whom he wanted, and they came to him. And he appointed twelve, whom he also named apostles, to be with him, and to be sent out to proclaim the message, and to have authority to cast out demons. So he appointed the twelve: Simon (to whom he gave the name Peter); James son of Zebedee and John the brother of James (to whom he gave the name Boanerges, that is, Sons of Thunder); and Andrew, and Philip, and Bartholomew, and Matthew, and Thomas, and James son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus, and Simon the Cananaean, and Judas Iscariot, who betrayed him.

We are delighted to announce the appointment of **Alice Gent** as Administrative Assistant in the Cathedral Office. Alice is a former member of the Cathedral Choir (as chorister, Head Chorister, and Lay Clerk) and her extended family has a long association with the Cathedral. She comes to the Cathedral with an extensive background in administrative support. Alice begins in the office in the week of 17 June.

Confirmation is one of the three sacraments of Christian initiation, along with Baptism and the Eucharist. Confirmation is a sign that a person has reached maturity and is now able to take responsibility for their own faith. It also strengthens and deepens the connection to the Church that is established at baptism. Confirmations are held occasionally as needs demand—we had Confirmations in late April, and Chad and Shane were confirmed last week—and we also organise a regular Confirmation each year. This year Confirmations will be held on **Sunday 25 August**. There will be short classes during the “Cathedral Kids” time beginning on Sunday 14 July. Please direct inquiries to Canon Jenny.

Last Sunday we launched our first major mission outreach plan, supporting the AnglicareSA Solar Panel project. This venture provides solar panel installations on community housing, with the ability for excess power to be consolidated and shared. We are aiming for a target of at least \$5,000, which will be increased considerably by the philanthropic support of two donors who will both match funding up to an amount of \$5,000; and AnglicareSA will likewise match the Cathedral’s total. So \$5,000 raised by the Cathedral community will generate \$20,000, enough for four complete installations that will benefit not only the residents of the properties but additional residents where the infrastructure for power sharing exists. **Tax Deductible donations** can be made direct to AnglicareSA through a dedicated donations page for the Cathedral at <https://anglicaresa.com.au/donate-support/solar-fundraising/>. You can scan the QR code to be taken directly to this page. **As of 30 May we have raised \$3,504 in Tax Deductible donations meaning the project already totals more than \$14,000: congratulations and thanks!**



In addition to cash donations, we will be hosting a **Car Boot Sale and Baked Goods fundraiser on Sunday 16 June** beginning after the 8 am Eucharist until around lunch time. We would greatly appreciate donations of baking goods and items in very good condition (e.g. gifts, books, games, clothes, toys, etc., but please note that electrical items cannot be accepted). Please deliver items to the CP Hall courtyard on the morning of 16 June. The Friends of the Cathedral will also be serving soup, so it promises to be quite a day.

AnglicareSA Socks and Underwear. In June we are also supporting the Magdalene Centre in the provision of socks and underwear for those in need. All items must be new and in unopened packaging. Multiple packs of socks and underwear are very useful. All donations will help, particularly small sized womens underwear. **Underwear** is an under-donated, yet most needed, item of clothing. No one should be deprived of the simple daily necessity of clean underwear that many of us take for granted. Hygiene and physical comfort are only a part of this basic human need.
