Welcome to St Peter's Cathedral. We are delighted to have you worship with us today for this Eucharist from A Prayer Book for Australia. Please join us in saying the words in bold. The hymns can be found in the separate hymn book. All indications for sitting, kneeling, and standing are a guide only: please do whatever is most comfortable for you.

St Peter's Cathedral resides on the lands of the Kaurna people. We give thanks for their ancestors and acknowledge the ongoing right and responsibility of their elders to care for this Country. We are committed to work and pray towards a more just settlement for all Indigenous people and pay our respect to First Nations people with us.

St Peter's Cathedral is a Christ-centred, sacramental, inclusive, thinking, mission-oriented faith community.

This morning, we welcome The Reverend Tracy Lauerson as preacher. Tracy is the National Program Manager of the Anglican Church of Australia Families and Culture Commission which seeks to educate people about Domestic and Family Violence and ways we can assist in addressing this serious problem. You may have noticed a purple bench sitting on the Pennigton Terrace side of the Memorial Garden. This bench commemorates women who have died because of domestic or family violence. This bench will be blessed at a short ceremony at 1.30pm.

Today we also celebrate 'Christ the King', the last Sunday of the Christian year. It is fitting that we celebrate Christ as the King of Peace in our deeply troubled and divided world. A reminder that as Christians we are called to proclaim peace by word and action in our homes, with our families, neighbours, and wider community. Our world so desperately needs peace. Let us all pray and work towards it.

We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.





The Purple Bench. The Diocese of Adelaide has a Domestic & Family Violence Working Group one of whose activities is to promote the annual "16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence" which takes place from 25 November (the International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women) to 10 December (Human Rights Day). This year the working group's focus is on "The Purple Bench," an international project to commemorate women who have died as a result of domestic or family violence.

The Working Group has received seed funding from Diocesan Council to support the installation of purple benches in the grounds of Anglican churches and institutions throughout the Diocese of Adelaide. The Cathedral will be the 'lead' institution with the unveiling and blessing of a bench near the Memorial Garden to launch this year's '16 Days'. Bishop Chris and the Rev'd Tracy Lauersen, National Program Manager of the Anglican Church of Australia's Families and Culture Commission, will preside at a ceremony to be held at **1.30 pm TODAY.**
