#### CEREMONY OF THE LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT CANDLE

Priest Today is the fourth Sunday in Advent. We light a candle each week to remind

us that Jesus brings light into the dark places of the world.

The first candle (purple, the Candle of Hope) is lit

Reader We light the candle of hope to proclaim that God's light

is coming into the world.

The second candle (purple, the Candle of Peace) is lit

Reader We light the candle of peace to proclaim that God's promises

will be fulfilled in the birth of Jesus - Prince of Peace.

The third candle (rose-pink, the Candle of Joy) is lit

Reader We light the candle of joy to celebrate that God's saving power

is coming into the world.

The fourth candle (purple, the Candle of Love) is lit

Reader We light the candle of love to celebrate that God's light has shone

in our darkened world through the child-bearing of blessed Mary.

All God of Love, grant that we who have seen your glory may daily be

renewed in your image and prepared like her for the coming of your

Son, who is the Lord and Saviour of all. Amen.

O LORD, raise up (we pray thee) thy power, and come among us, and with great might succour us; that whereas, through our sins and wickedness, we are sore let and hindered in running the race that is set before us, thy bountiful grace and mercy may speedily help and deliver us; through the satisfaction of thy Son our Lord, to whom with thee and the Holy Ghost be honour and glory, world without end. **Amen.**

A reading from the Prophet Micah.

But you, O Bethlehem of Ephrathah,

who are one of the little clans of Judah,

HEBREWS 10:5-10

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews.

When Christ came into the world, he said,

'Sacrifices and offerings you have not desired,

in burnt-offerings and sin-offerings

you have taken no pleasure.

Then I said, "See, God, I have come to do your will, O God"

(in the scroll of the book it is written of me).'

When he said above, 'You have neither desired nor taken pleasure in sacrifices and offerings and burnt-offerings and sin-offerings' (these are offered according to the law), then he added, 'See, I have come to do your will.' He abolishes the first in order to establish the second. And it is by God's will that we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.

THE GOSPEL LUKE 1.39–45

The Lord be with you.

And with thy spirit.

The Holy Gospel is written in the 1st Chapter of the Gospel according to Luke, beginning at verse 39.

#### Glory be to thee, O Lord.

In those days Mary set out and went with haste to a Judean town in the hill country, where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leapt in her womb. And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit and exclaimed with a loud cry, 'Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. And why has this happened to me, that the mother of my Lord comes to me? For as soon as I heard the sound of your greeting, the child in my womb leapt for joy. And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfilment of what was spoken to her by the Lord.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Praise be to thee, O Christ.

#### January Worship Schedule

The weekday worship schedule from Christmas to the end of January is according to the "January" pattern with Morning and Evening Prayer said privately, and the Eucharist celebrated on Wednesday at 7:30 am and 10 am (BCP), and Friday at 7:30 am. This pattern will commence from Thursday 26 December until Friday 31 January.

On Sunday 29 December the Eucharist will be celebrated at 8 am and 10:30 am as usual, but there will be no 6 pm service. On Wednesday I January, there will be no 7:30 am Eucharist, but the BCP Eucharist will be celebrated as usual at 10 am.

During January, Sunday worship will be at the usual times of 8 am (BCP Eucharist), 10:30 am (Sung Eucharist) and 6 pm (Night Prayer).


