Welcome to St Peter's Cathedral. We are delighted to have you worship with us today for this service of Choral Evensong from the Book of Common Prayer. As the clergy and choir lead this service, allow the words and music to bring you into a stillness and prayerful reflection with God. Please join us in saying the words in bold. The hymns can be found in the separate hymn book. Indications for sitting, kneeling, and standing are a guide only.

St Peter's Cathedral resides on the lands of the Kaurna people. We give thanks for their ancestors and acknowledge the ongoing right and responsibility of their elders to care for this Country. We are committed to work and pray towards a more just settlement for all Indigenous people and pay our respect to First Nations people with us.

St Peter's Cathedral is a Christ-centred, sacramental, inclusive, thinking, mission-oriented faith community.

Tonight we celebrate St Matthias. We know little about Matthias, other than the reference in this evening's reading from Acts, where Luke states that Matthias had been closely associated with Jesus and the 12 apostles since the onset of the ministry of Jesus at his baptism by John the Baptist.

Unlike at the last supper where the 12 were gathered with Jesus, here in the upper rom in Jerusalem were also some women who had a significant role in the proclamation of the gospel, and Mary, the mother of Jesus, as well as his brothers. It was a community gathering.

So here we have a pattern for all our important decisions as a Christian community. The community, not just the 11 apostles, were all involved fully in the discussion over who would replace Judas Iscariot, and by lot between Justus and Matthias, Matthias won.

THE FIRST LESSON

ACTS 1.14-17, 20-26

The lesson from the Acts of the Apostles, chapter 1, beginning at verse 14.

All these were constantly devoting themselves to prayer, together with certain women, including Mary the mother of Jesus, as well as his brothers.

In those days Peter stood up among the believers (together the crowd numbered about one hundred and twenty people) and said, 'Friends, the scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit through David foretold concerning Judas, who became a guide for those who arrested Jesus— for he was numbered among us and was allotted his share in this ministry.'

'For it is written in the book of Psalms,

"Let his homestead become desolate, and let there be no one to live in it";

and

"Let another take his position of overseer."

So one of the men who have accompanied us throughout the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us, beginning from the baptism of John until the day when he was taken up from us—one of these must become a witness with us to his resurrection.' So they proposed two, Joseph called Barsabbas, who was also known as Justus, and Matthias. Then they prayed and said, 'Lord, you know everyone's heart. Show us which one of these two you have chosen to take the place in this ministry and apostleship from which Judas turned aside to go to his own place.' And they cast lots for them, and the lot fell on Matthias; and he was added to the eleven apostles.

SECOND LESSON

The lesson from Gospel according to John, chapter 15, beginning at verse 9.

As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete.

'This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another.


To help keep St Peter's Cathedral open for the people of Adelaide and beyond
